It is a hundred years ago that the Savoy Theatre was opened by Rupert D'Oyly Carte in London the first theatre to be lit by electricity. Arthur Sullivan was in poor health (with 'kidney trouble') for the opening night of "Princess Ida" on 5th January, 1884. He had a strong injection to ease the pain and a strong cup of coffee to keep himself awake. He describes a 'tremendous house... a very fine reception ... not a hitch... brilliant success.'

Here in Winchester the W.A.O.S. has been established for 69 years and on this occasion we are proud to be presenting our 60th production. It is 15 years since "Princess Ida" was last performed and there were several in the cast then, and indeed in the previous production of 1952, who are well known names today (including our Musical Director).

We like to think that we have been able to achieve and maintain a high standard of production over these years and that the 1981 "Princess Ida" will be no exception.

We very much hope that you will enjoy the performance and — in W. S. Gilbert's words — will find 'nothing whatever to grumble at.'



PRINCESS IDA or . . CASTLE ADAMANT

SYNOPSIS

Princess Ida, the daughter of King Gama, was betrothed at the age of one to Hilarion, the son of King Hildebrand. There is doubt as to whether or not the marriage agreement will be honoured because Ida, a strong willed, independent young woman of twenty-one, has established a university for women in Castle Adamant from which all men are excluded. King Gama and his three sons, arriving at Hildebrand's court without Ida are imprisoned by Hildebrand, and Hilarion departs with two friends to Castle Adamant to claim his bride. Gama is to be hanged if Hilarion fails to return safely.

Within Castle Adamant man is vocally despised by all and Ida is hailed as a mighty maiden with a mission. Hilarion and his friends Cyril and Florian in female dress, break into the university and are discovered by Ida who readily accepts them as three new students. One of the 'new students', however is recognised by his sister, Lady Psyche but is not penounced although a genuine student, Melissa, is also drawn into the conspiracy. Unfortunately, too much wine is consumed during lunch by the 'new student' Cyril who gives himself away by trying to kiss all the girls. The Princess is horrified and promptly falls in to the river which runs by the castle. Hilarion gallantly rescues her but even so Ida still arrests him and his friends. Hildebrand's army has arrived and the castle walls are stormed. The Princess remains defiant even though her father's and brothers' lives will be taken if she does not yield to Hildebrand's ultimatum.

The Princess faces rebellion within the ranks of her forces as the surgeon refuses to amputate live limbs, the bandswomen refuse to play and she is obliged to do all her own blowing-up with gun powder. Hildebrand despatches Gama with a message that because he loathes fighting women, their differences should be settled by a fight between the sons of Gama and the three new students. The Princess reluctantly agrees.

The sons of Gama are defeated and, seeing her brothers wounded, the Princess capitulates, resigning herself to Hilarion. Hildebrand and Gama bury the hatchet and Lady Blanche becomes principal of the university, a position she has always coveted. So all ends happily, as it should.


