The need for a charity for young people in Winchester emerged from the local homeless and night shelter projects. Many of the adults using these services had experienced difficulties in childhood and were at risk of unemployment and homelessness before they had reached 16, and so, in 1983 the charity was formed.

The charities core work is to reach out into the community to get to know and understand young people and their needs in order that support could be offered to young people with unmet needs that are not engaging with other services.

There are some differences between the original 1994 film The Adventures of Priscilla, Queen of the Desert and Priscilla Queen of the Desert The Musical.

Did you spot them?

ABBA OR KYLIE?

Although Kylie was already an international pop princess back in 1994, ABBA was Adam's music obsession in the film. ABBA: The Movie was filmed during their Australian tour in 1977 and captured the

nation's love for the band, culminating in the 1994 film with Adam proudly showing off his famous 'ABBA turd' to a bemused Bernadette.

MITZ. ME DARLING

Tick's drag persona in the film is Mitzi Del Bra, but in the musical she is instead Mitzi Mitosis.

COCK, IN A FROCK, ON A ROCK

In the film, the three queens in full drag regalia climb Watarrka (Kings Canyon), about 200 miles southwest of Alice Springs. The musical, however, sees the queens

climb to the top of Uluru (Ayres Rock) in the final scene. This was the filmmakers original intention, but they could not get permission to film at such a sacred site.



GRAFFITI...

After leaving the antics at the bar in Broken Hill, the queens find Priscilla has been vandalised with homophobic graffiti. The musical sees the bus plastered with "F*ck off f*ggots",

but in the film they instead find "AIDS f*ckers go home". The film was released in 1994 at the height of the HIV/AIDS epidemic which devastated the gay community who were often targets of abuse surrounding the virus.

Holly Reedman SHIRLEY




