
### Derek Beck - Musical Director



### Ann Cobbold

### 23rd JULY 1944 - 5th AUGUST 1998

Sadly this year has seen the death of Ann who worked so tirelessly for the Society and was a tremendous friend to all. She was often the mainstay of the backstage team, taking on any job asked of her, frequently as prompt. The Society misses the smiling face and cheerful rapport of this very special person.



### HELLO, DOLLY

Hello, Dolly! is based on the play 'The Matchmaker' by Thornton Wilder. It is the story of Mrs Dolly Levi's efforts to marry Horace Vandergelder, the well known Yonkers half-a-millionaire, so that she can send his money circulating like rainwater, the way her late husband, Ephraim Levi, taught her.

Along the way Dolly also succeeds in matching up the young and beautiful widow Molloy with Vandergelder's chief clerk, Cornelius Hackl; Cornelius' assistant - Barnaby Tucker with Minnie Fay, Mrs Molloy's assistant; and the struggling artist Ambrose Kemper with Mr Vandergelder's weeping niece, Ermengarde.

Dolly makes her way to the Vandergelder's Hay and Feed store in Yonkers, then by train back to New York where she is to meet Mr Vandergelder outside Mrs Molloy's Hat Shop. Cornelius and Barnaby are forced to seek refuge in the shop when they see Vandergelder sitting on a bench waiting for Dolly, who takes full advantage of this unexpected situation by persuading Horace to meet a certain lady by the name of Miss Money in the Fourteenth Street Association parade.

When Horace leaves the hat shop Dolly's attention returns to Mrs Molloy who is threatening to send for the police. She soon has everything under her control when she states that Cornelius and Barnaby should take the two offended ladies to dinner at the most expensive restaurant in town, The Harmonia Gardens, where the plot thickens.

What happens in the end? Well, Dolly gets her man, of course, and he is delighted she caught him. As Dolly takes a peep into Vandergelder's bulging cash register she promises that his fortune will soon be put to good use, and quotes her late husband Ephraim: "Money, pardon the expression, is like manure. Its not worth a thing unless it's spread around, encouraging young things to grow."
